Have the Right Adapter?

The Ford Fast Charging Adapter is approved for use on designated Tesla Superchargers and other DC Fast Chargers with NACS connections. See Charts on Page 2.

IMPORTANT NOTE: To avoid the risk of serious injury and property damage, <u>only use NACS DC</u> adapters sold or provided by Ford or Tesla for use at Tesla Superchargers. Tesla <u>prohibits</u> the use of any other adapter with Tesla charging stations. Ford <u>does not guarantee</u> compatibility with aftermarket charging adapters.

Can multiple adapters be combined?

No. Ford <u>only recommends</u> using a Ford-approved adapter as instructed.

How to Purchase a Ford Fast Charging Adapter

Scan the QR code above to purchase the Ford Fast Charging Adapter (NACS). The adapter will only work with designated Tesla and non-Tesla NACS DC Fast Chargers.

It is <u>not</u> designed to work with AC chargers (Home Chargers, Tesla Destination Chargers, or publicly available Level 1 and Level 2 Chargers).

Do Customers Need an Adapter?


The Tesla Supercharger Network has been integrated into Ford's **BlueOval**™ Charge Network. All Ford vehicles will require a **Ford Fast Charging (NACS) adapter** in order to use Tesla Superchargers. Ford has an approved adapter for use at Tesla Superchargers called the Ford Fast Charging Adapter (NACS).

What Ford tools will inform if an adapter is needed?

FordPass or the Public Charging app can inform owners when a Fast Charging Adapter is needed for a Tesla Supercharger.
